Description:

The purpose of the American Heart Association (AHA) CPR Instructor's Course is to provide the opportunity to acquire the knowledge and skills necessary to instruct and evaluate the potential CPR providers.

The CPR Instructor's Course will provide the participant with:

- AHA Emergency Cardiovascular Care (ECC) educational philosophy & national AHA policies and procedures affecting all ECC instructors.
- Sufficient background information for comprehension of CPR subject matter.
- Information on teaching methods.
- An understanding of the educational aids available for teaching provider courses.
- The opportunity to develop effective presentation abilities.

Prerequisites:

- Candidates must present a current AHA Healthcare Provider card & must have scored 90 percent on the written exam.
- Candidates must have a letter from a Community Training Center Coordinator (CTC) indicating that the candidate will be registering with that CTC.
- Candidates must have the willingness and desire to teach in accordance with the scientific and program guidelines of the AHA.
- Candidates must make a commitment to teach four courses in a two-year period according to AHA guidelines.

Instructor Course Completion:

1. Successful completion of an AHA CPR Instructor Course.
2. Satisfactory performance of lecture and skill presentation.
3. A thorough knowledge of course content, including appropriate textbook and instructor's manual.
4. A score of 90 percent or better must be achieved on the written exam.
5. After successful completion of an AHA Instructor Course, the candidate must be monitored while teaching his or her first AHA provider course - within 90 days of completing the Instructor course.
6. Skills in manikin maintenance must be demonstrated.
